## What are meaningful, realistic things I can do right now?

#### END THE WAR ON BLACK PEOPLE

- Educate yourself on the **school-to-prison pipeline** and support legislation to stop it.
- Stop laws which disproportionately harm Black people and the most marginalized populations, via **#BanTheBox, Chicago Community Bond Fund, No Money Bond.**
- Support restorative justice efforts like the first ever **Restorative Justice** Community Court in North Lawndale.
- Attend an Alternatives to Calling the Police workshop put on by SURJ-Chicago.
- Volunteer with ICIRR, CRLN, and OCAD to stop deportations and protect immigrations.

### REPARATIONS

- Support full and free access to education for all Black people via SocialWorks Youth Empowerment.
- Support efforts to demand reparations from University of Chicago.
- Guarantee a minimum livable income via **Fight for \$15 Chicago.**
- Read the compelling The Atlantic article *The Case for Reparations* by Ta-Nehisi Coates and the book *The New Jim Crow* by Michelle Alexander.
- Support public education curriculum and funding for cultural sites by supporting the DuSable Museum and the CTU.
- Contact your representatives about H.R.40: "Commission to Study Reparation . . . Act."

### INVEST – DIVEST

- Support **#MedicareForAll** and **universal health care campaigns** and contact your legislators
- Advocate for proper allocation of TIF money: instead of giving TIF money to Rahm's donors' projects, use TIF money to reinvest in low-income communities and fully fund CPS and community health clinics.
- Support the **#NoCopAcademy** and advocate for the \$95 to reinvest in communities.
- Contact your alderperson about **divesting the city from fossil fuel investments.**
- Contact your banks, elected officials, and retirement funds to divest from prisons.

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#### ECONOMIC JUSTICE

- Educate yourself about progressive tax plans & governor candidates' tax plans.
- Support laws that expand work access to marginalized populations (e.g. Ban the Box).
- Support expanding access to unions & living wage efforts such as Fight for \$15.
- Advocate for ethical re-negotiation of TPP, NAFTA, FTAA, CAFTA.
- Support coops whenever possible.
- Support residents of West Calumet Housing Project displaced by toxic lead.
- Support the **Breathing Room Space Coop** on 1434 W 51st Street. They have a "rent party" fundraiser on Sat. 1/27 9pm-1am.
- Support Assata's Daughter's community garden in the spring and summer.
- Support **Black Lives Matter-Chicago's food box** on 51<sup>st</sup> and Calumet.

#### **COMMUNITY CONTROL**

- In Chicago, work to enact the Civilian Police Accountability Council Ordinance (CPAC). The Chicago Alliance Against Racist and Political Repression is coordinating this campaign.
- To bring the Chicago Public Schools an elected school board, work with the coalition of organizations that have pushed IL H.B. 557 to overwhelming passage in the IL House. It now needs to overcome resistance in the IL Senate.
- To have even a chance of adopting needs based budgeting at the federal level, work to elect a progressive majority to the U.S. House and Senate, as well as to the Presidency. This means donations and sometimes volunteering in swing districts/states. In Illinois, we need to elect a progressive as Governor to have a chance at needs based budgeting.

### POLITICAL POWER

- Support Indivisible Chicago, which meets at our church.
- Inform residents of automatic voter registration.
- Assist underrepresented individuals in getting to voting polls.
- Provide court support for activists via NLG and other organizations.
- Volunteer with National Lawyers Guild (NLG) to support protesters.
- Advocate for release of political prisoners and review of COINTELPRO.
- Contact senators to **protect Net Neutrality.**
